Russian Grafting Supplies List

This class is a stand-alone techniques class. Russian Grafting is an alternative to mattress stitch for joining knitting pieces together, such as afghan blocks, sweater front and back, underarm seams, etc. I do not recommend this technique for shoulder seams.

Reasons to use Russian Grafting:

- 1. No sewing, except to tack down the final loop. The technique is done with your knitting needles.
- 2. No additional yarn required. You pick up stitches and graft them together.
- 3. The technique is the same for any stitch pattern. We will graft garter stitch, but the technique works the same for stockinette, elongated stitch, lace, colorwork, etc.
- 4. The technique produces a flatter seam than most seaming techniques. Looks great for afghans or any item where the back is visible.

Skill Level:

Easy. Students should be able to knit, purl, cast on, bind off, and pick up stitches.

Supplies:

Double-pointed needles (same size as you used for your swatches), scissors, locking stitch markers.

Homework:

Two swatches in contrasting colors. Using worsted weight yarn, and needles that will give you a gauge of 4.5 to 5 stitches per inch, cast on 20 stitches. Knit 20 rows (garter stitch). Do not slip the first stitch in each row. Do not bind off. Leave a tail of about 5 inches, and cut or break the yarn. Leave your stitches on your needle or put them on a holder. Make your second swatch exactly the same, but in a contrasting color.
